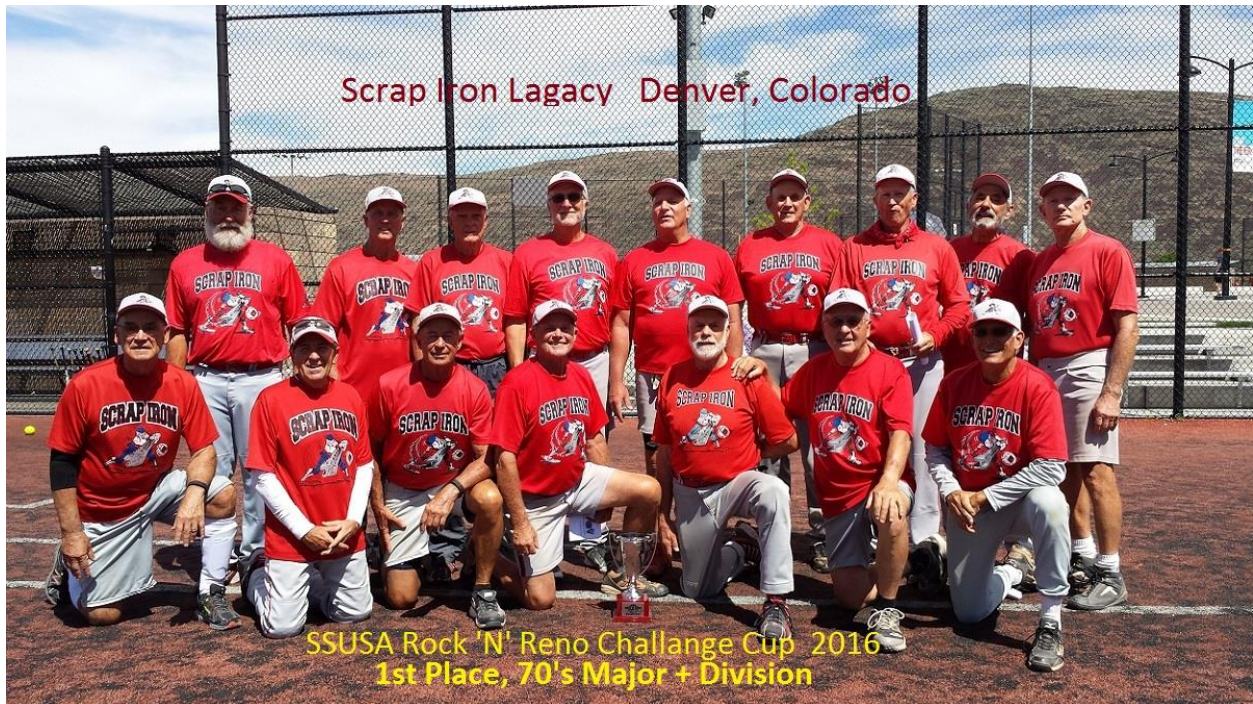

Our Old Guys Rule at Rock 'N Reno

Our 70s, 75s, and 80s teams were high place finishers in Reno. The 70 Legacy had another battle with Omen winning two out of three head to head games and the “70 Major Plus Championship.” The 70 Reds finished second in 70 AAA, but may have played the most grueling tournament on record for a Scrap Iron team. The Reds played 11 games in this ten team division. Tuesday was their “easy” day as they won their two pool games. Wednesday didn’t start well when they lost their first bracket game. In order to survive to the last day they had to play and win three more games on Wednesday. They showed up at Golden Eagle Park on Thursday faced with five consecutive wins to be the Champions. They almost pulled it off winning the first four, but couldn’t win in the “If Game.” If playing 11 games isn’t enough of a story, the fact that they only had 11 players to cover the 11 fielding positions makes their tournament even more remarkable.
