Team News

The Scrap Iron 80’s are a new AAA team for the 2023 season. We placed third at the Winter World Championships at Bell Bank Park in Mesa, Arizona, November 15-17. Our three all-tournament players were SS Orville Strain, LF Tom Imming, and 2B Dave Cox.

In the three-game round robin, we lost two games by one run and beat a major level team by 10 runs. In the playoff bracket, we won our first game by 2 runs and our second game by 6 runs. On Thursday morning, we lost to the #2 Seed by one run and the #1 Seed by 9 runs because they scored 11 runs in the top of the open inning.

We consider our first tournament to be a very good start because we got to know each other and enjoyed playing in this new \$280 million facility that has eight all-artificial turf fields for softball and baseball.

Our roster has five out of state players and 13 players from Colorado. Our Manager is Dennis Lutz, assisted by Ron Howard. It looks like our next tournament will be January 31 - February 2 in Palm Springs, California. We have our eyes on around 5 to 6 more tournaments before the Winter Worlds in Las Vegas.

We took 2nd place, which was a great accomplishment in our first tournament playing together as a new TEAM. I want to share some softball news with all of you. About 16 months ago, Penne's coach from her Florida team (Ruth Felmuth, HOF class of 2008) nominated her for the National Senior Hall of Fame. Penne has played with Ruth for the last 5 years and we've become good friends. After being nominated, the work began!

Not sure if any of you know what the process is for the National HOF, but they require that the applicant submit an extensive "Resume" book to the committee for review and consideration to be placed on the ballot. It's required that you document all of your achievements during your senior softball career. With the help of Ron Howard, we began digging thru old photos and awards and tournament results. They also require that you submit letters of recommendation from teammates, coach's etc. Jamie and Rick wrote Penne two wonderful letters talking about her dedication and commitment to the game that they witnessed at all of the practices we had together in Longmont. Even though it was a lot of work, it was also a lot of fun going thru old photos and tournament results, remembering special people and moments at the different events all over the country. We worked on the book for 3 months and submitted it to the committee last November.

The ballots finally came out to the current members of the Hall on November 1st and they had until the end of the month to submit their votes. We're on vacation with our daughter this past week and on Monday Penne received the "Call from the Hall" that she has been voted in! It was special that the 3 of us could be together.

Penne gets to choose where she will be inducted during a senior tournament, probably an event where her Florida team is playing. The National Hall of Fame includes all of the senior sanctioned organizations we play under, SSUSA, SPA, ISSA, ISA, ASA and the Huntsman, but is administered by SPA.

There are now 68 Women in the United States that are in the Hall and Penne is one of them. We have received many forms of congratulations including a very nice letter from Dave Dowel, National director of SSUSA. Since you all are special to both of us we

wanted to share this great news with you. I'm incredibly proud of my Wife as I know how hard she has worked and continues to work to be the best example of what Senior Softball is about. Weeks after receiving this prestigious honor, he competed in the Winter Worlds in Mesa, Arizona in both the 60s Major and 65 Major categories. Playing first with High Octane (65s), the team went 4-2 winning their bracket of 7 teams. Their only losses were to a 65 Major + team. Next, Carl joined Scrap Iron Peak/Storage Time for their 60s Major tournament of 13 teams. After losing their first game in tournament play, Charlie Graham's squad of 11 1/2 (Joe Ribeiro dislocated his throwing arm but pinch ran in every game.) rattled off 6 straight victories to capture the 60s Major Winter World Championship. Great team effort. So... 6 days, 16 games (11-5 record), over 100 innings played but most noteworthy **two World Titles** in one tournament!
