I was born in a suburb of Los Angeles and grew up in LA. I earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering from University of Wyoming and then served in the Navy's Civil Engineer Corps as an officer. When I was released from active duty in 1967, I worked for consulting civil engineering firms in Southern California, which is when I started playing fast pitch softball.

A year after I married my wife Beverly in August 1969, we left California to work for a Colorado company in Texas and Oklahoma, and that company moved us to Colorado in January 1972. I played fast pitch softball for several years in the Denver area, and then had to quit due to my employment situations until 1990, when I turned 50 and was able to start playing in CSSA's slow pitch softball program in Broomfield. I remember meeting Bob Gryzmala and Austin Connelly shortly after that, as they were wearing Scrap Iron clothing. Bob sponsored the teams I played on under the name of his company, R G Insulation.

I started my own consulting structural engineering firm in Broomfield in 1980, which gave me an opportunity to play CSSA recreation softball on Wednesday mornings off and on for a few years, because I was my own boss. I completely retired in 2006, and started playing every summer out of Broomfield, even after we moved to Erie in 2008.

In 2011, Bob Gryzmala "recruited" me to play on the Scrap Iron 70's team Bob Wiltgen was managing. I played with Bob's team the next four years and have many fine memories of all the things our team accomplished.

I "aged up" to 75 in January 2015. I took over the existing Scrap Iron's 75's team because the manager the previous year had been stricken with a stroke. With the help of Bob Wiltgen and several other Scrap Iron players, I was able to put together a AAA 75's team for the Southwest Championships in Las Vegas in April 2015, and we won that tournament as a brand-new team. Our next tournament was in Reno, where we won by an average of 9.8 runs per game; as a result, SSUSA immediately moved us up to the Major level, where we remained until I had to disband the team in the spring of 2018 due to the lack of healthy players. Our team adopted the "Beams"

name in 2016, which is when we won the National Championship in Las Vegas. Again, this team created a lot of great memories, and we had a lot of fun, plus I enjoyed managing this fine group of players from five different states.

I have been President, Secretary, and Treasurer of several professional and social organizations throughout my life, and I am very happy to serve as the Secretary of Scrap Iron's executive board. **J. C. Moore**

I have been active in Senior Softball for 19 years and many of them have been with teams associated with Scrap Iron. Scrap Iron has been an innovator in Senior Softball, showing other states just how effective a group can be, driven by one goal, the pursuit of softball. Scrap Iron Teams for the 2021 season

50 Major Elite – Mike Christopher

Elite 50s will be competing in 50-major for the second year in 2021.

The 2020 year started off rough going 1-4 in Winter Worlds. While we weren't happy with our finish, we knew the team's potential wasn't even scratched. COVID kicked in and tournaments were few and far in between. Our next tournament was June 2020 and the SOCAL State Championships. The team played much better going 1-1 in pool play. After losing our first game in bracket play, we rattled off 4 wins before losing in losers bracket final, going 8-3 and taking third. Next up was the Western National which was move to St. George in August. The team really showed our potential as the 20 team 50-major bracket was filled with 5 that would finish top 10 at worlds that year. We went 6-3 and took a respectable 4th place. Worlds was moved to the beginning of November, and by then COVID had decimated the roster. Not physically, but emotionally. We didn't show up and finished 2-3. After retooling the roster, we were hopeful that 2021 would start off differently than 2020. We registered to play Winter Worlds again in Phoenix but could not attend as three members tested positive the week before the tournament. While disappointed, I believe everything happens for a reason, which in our case meant picking up 5 new player to begin the 2021 calendar year, putting us in an even more competitive position as we travel to the Top Gun Spring Tune Up in Yuma for the first tournament of 2021!

After taking 2nd Place at the World Masters in 2020, we were bumped up to 50 Majors. With the move to majors, we knew we were going to have to boost the talent level of the team. For many people that have coached before, it's a lot of mental work to manage the team, and then you have to get mentally prepared to play softball at a high level. Scott is very good at this portion of managing the team, and this allows me to focus on my individual softball preparation and play. With the deletion and addition of several players for the 2021 season, we both felt that we should start the "New" Team with a different name, and different uniforms.
